2. 付属のタッピンねじ2つを使用し、型板を使用してドリルで開けた穴2つにカメラを固定します。
 - 刻印された<◁>マークがカメラの監視方向を向くようにセットします。
3. 対応するケーブルを用いカメラ内部の端末を接続します。
4. “カメラの監視方向の調整”セクションを参照してレンズを目的の方向に調整します。(17 ページ)



- ! ■ カメラのレンズは製造の最終工程の段階で、適切な場所に焦点が合わせられているため、レンズには触れないようにしてください。もし触れてしまうと、レンズの焦点がずれるか、異物により汚れるおそれがあります。
5. 内側のカバーを本体に接続します。
 6. カメラの底面を掴み、もう片方手でカバーを掴んで押して図のように2つの矢印マークを揃えます。
 - ! ■ ドームカバーを組み立てるには、矢印同士を一致させ、カバーをしっかり押してください。
ドームカバーを回転させ組み立てたり、正確に組み立てない場合、乱反射現象が発生したり、レンズ部分が回転し撮影範囲が変更されることがあります。
 - 図に示すように、ドームカバーが正しく底部に接続されていることを確認します。
スナップフィットが正しく接続されていないと、ドームカバーが倒れ、けがの原因になる場合があります。

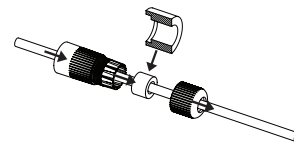

- ブラケットを使用してカメラ位置を調整するとき、ブラケットねじを緩め、カメラを調節し、締め付けます。ねじが固定されている状態で力任せに調節しようすると、傷がつく恐れがあります。

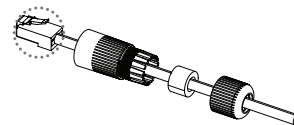


RJ45 防水ケーブルを LAN ケーブルに接続する方法

1. 矢印の方向に挿入します。

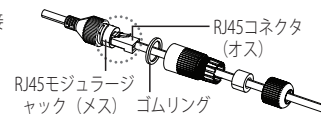


2. LAN コネクタ（オス）をケーブルに接続します。

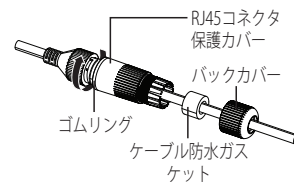


3. RJ45 モジュージャック（メス）を RJ45 コネクタ（オス）に接続します。

- 部品はそれぞれ分かれたままにしてください。

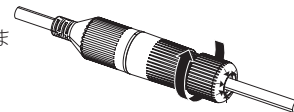


4. RJ45 モジュージャック（メス）と RJ45 保護カバーを時計回りに回転させて組み立てます（矢印に従う）。



5. RJ45 保護カバーとバックカバーを時計回りに回転させて組み立てます（矢印に従う）。バックカバーを組み立てるとき、ケーブル防水ガスケットをケーブルにしっかり取り付けて防水します。

- これを完全に組み立て、RJ45コネクタのねじ山の端までバックカバーを回転させます。

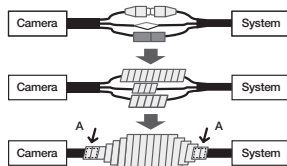


屋外設置

建物の外に本製品を取り付ける際、屋外に接続されたケーブルとの隙間から水が漏入しないように、防水ブチルゴムテープ（店舗で購入することができます）を使って防水してください。

1. 電源、I/O、AUDIO、および LAN ケーブルを接続します。
2. 防水ブチルゴムテープの半分以上が重なるようにして黒のケーブルジャケット（エリア A）とケーブル接続箇所を巻きつけます。

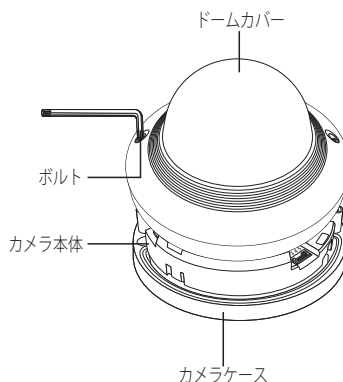

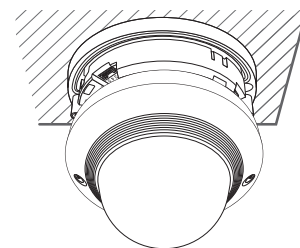

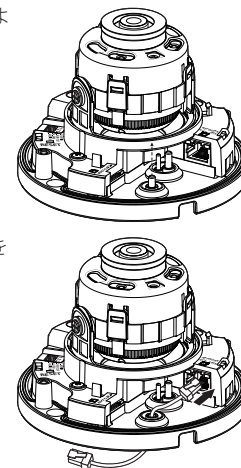

2. 下部の穴をアンカーの穴に固定し、タッピングネジ（M4.5xL50）を挿入して固定します。
3. 必要なケーブルを接続して、カメラ取付け時に損傷したりねじれないように配線します。
4. “カメラの監視方向の調整”セクションを参照してレンズを目的の方向に調整します。（17ページ）
5. ドーム型カバーを閉じてください。
 - L型レンチを使用し締め付けボルトを確実に締め、水漏れを防ぎます。



LAN ケーブルを接続する

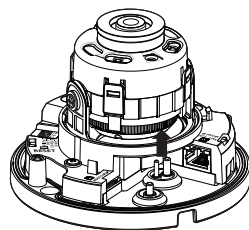
1. ドーム型カバー及びケースを取り外してください。
 2. 底部のラバープラグの長く突き出た部分を引き、図に表示されているように取り外してください。
- LANケーブルと接続するのに適切なケーブルブッシュを使用してください。
- 基本のカメラ：直径5.0～6.5mmのケーブルを使用してください。
 - 同梱のコンポーネント：直径7.0～8.5mmのケーブルを使用してください。

3. LANケーブルを上記のステップ2にあるラバープラグの突き出た部分を取り外して作った大きい穴に挿入してください。
4. 覆いをケーブルカッターで取り外し、ケーブルを調整してください。
5. LANケーブルをLANコネクタで接続し、LANツールに挿入してください。
6. 完成したケーブルをEthernetポートに接続してください。

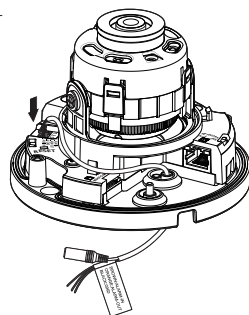

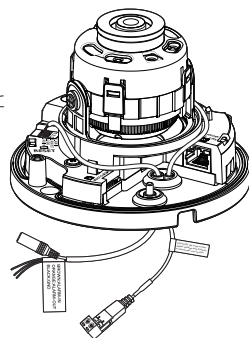

5. アラーム/音声ケーブルにあるゴムキャップを穴に付けます。



6. 小さいホールを通して電源ケーブルを入れ、長い溝に沿って電源ケーブルを入れてください。
7. 電源ケーブルを電源端子ブロックに接続してください。
8. “カメラの監視方向の調整”セクションを参照してレンズを目的の方向に調整します。(17ページ)

カメラの監視方向の調整 (QND-6010R/6020R/6030R, QNV-6010R/6020R/6030R)



■ 監視方向の調整

カメラが天井に固定されている場合にのみカメラの方向を調整できます。
この場合、カメラユニットを左右に回すことをパンニング、上下角度を調整することをチルト、軸を中心にレ
ンズを回転することを回転と言います。

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It appears that the arithmetic coding option of the JPEG spec is covered by patents owned by IBM, AT&T, and Mitsubishi. Hence arithmetic coding cannot legally be used without obtaining one or more licenses. For this reason, support for arithmetic coding has been removed from the free JPEG software. (Since arithmetic coding provides only a marginal gain over the unpatented Huffman mode, it is unlikely that very many implementations will support it.) So far as we are aware, there are no patent restrictions on the remaining code.

The IJG distribution formerly included code to read and write GIF files. To avoid entanglement with the Unisys LZW patent, GIF reading support has been removed altogether, and the GIF writer has been simplified to produce "uncompressed GIFs". This technique does not use the LZW algorithm; the resulting GIF files are larger than usual, but are readable by all standard GIF decoders.
