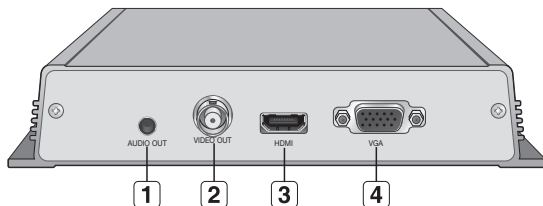

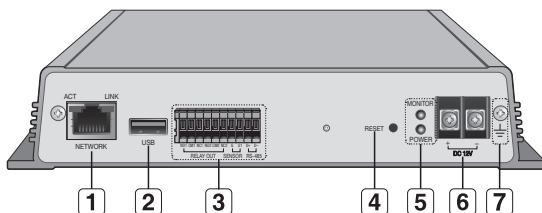

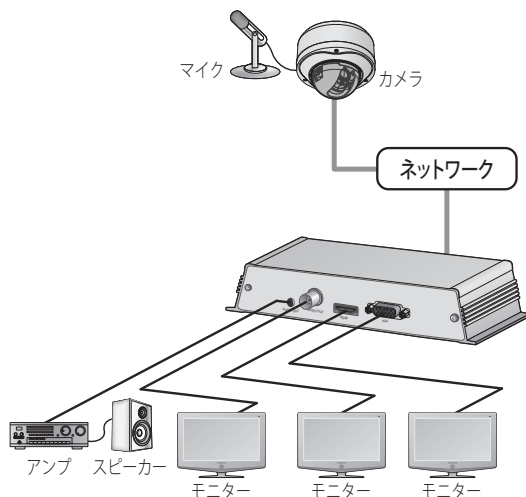

ビデオ出力に接続する

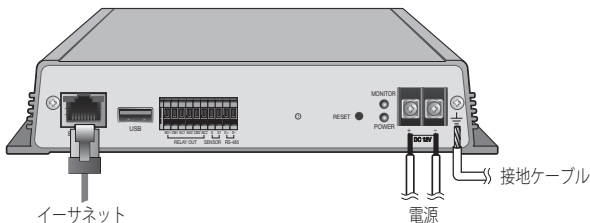
モニターを、使用するネットワークビデオデコーダーのビデオ出力に接続します。

- 映像はWeb Viewerの「表示設定 > モニター」の設定に応じて、ポートを介して出力されます。(37ページ)
- HDMIまたはVGA出力モードでは、モニターで設定した解像度がサポートされていない場合、表示は正しくレンダリングされません。
- **[RESET]**ボタンを1秒間押すと、ビデオ出力モードに変わります。
- モードに応じてモニターLEDの色が変わります。

音声入力/出力に接続する

1. マイクをネットワークカメラまたはエンコーダーに接続し、該当するデバイスの音声を<ON>に設定します。
2. ビデオデコーダーのシングルレイアウト設定で、ネットワークAUDIO SETUPをONに設定し、音声設定のライン出力とHDMI出力から該当の出力を選択します。
音声出力HDMI OUTは、モニター出力をHDMIに設置している場合にのみ選択することができます。
3. ライン出力を使用するには、スピーカーのLINE IN端子とネットワークビデオデコーダーのAUDIO OUT端子とを接続します。
4. HDMI出力の場合、HDMIモニターをHDMIポートに接続します。
 - HDMI音声出力の場合、内蔵スピーカー付きのモニターが必要です。

ドライバーを使用して、電源ケーブルの各線(+、-)をネットワークビデオデコーダーの対応する電源ポートに接続します。

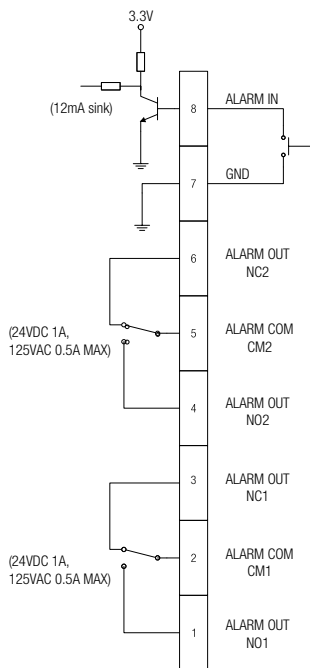

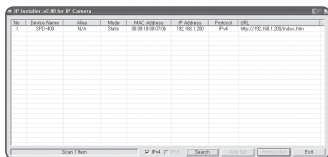

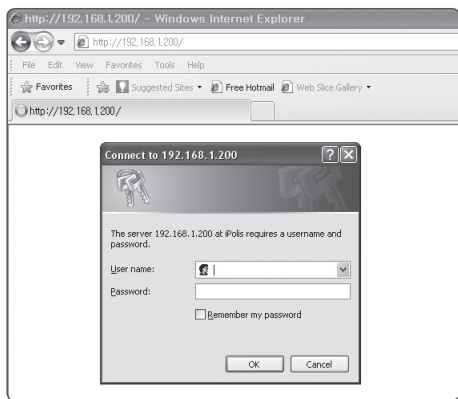

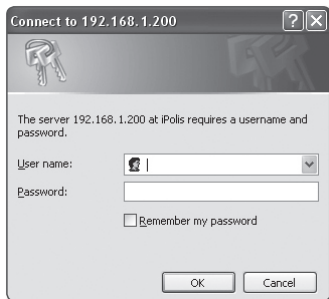
